Access to accurate information is key to Student Success.



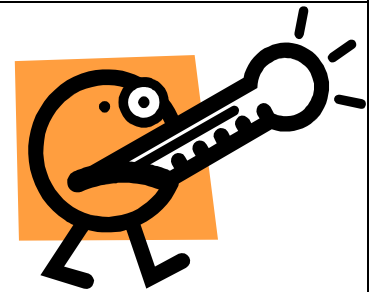
What happens if I am too sick to go to school?

Did you know?

You can continue to get credit for attending school through the **Home/Hospital Program**. Students can receive instruction at home by a licensed teacher if they are too sick to attend school. High school students can continue to receive credit toward graduation when enrolled in the **Home/Hospital Program**.

Home/Hospital Program

If you are so sick that you will be out of school for ten days or longer, there is a school program available for you. With a doctor's authorization (see link below), you may qualify for the Granite School District Home/Hospital Program. Once qualified, you will have two hours of school instruction per week, at home, from a licensed teacher. Homework will be assigned to cover the content and material that is being taught in your classes while you are sick.



Doctor's authorizations are required each term if you need to continue in the home/hospital service.

Students are referred to the Home/Hospital Program by a school counselor or a school administrator. Your counselor or principal will be able to refer you to this program and help you access the doctor's note.
