What are my high school diploma options?

Did you know?

Students actually begin working toward their high school diploma the day they begin school. Then, in 9th grade, work begins on the specific requirements for high school graduation. As students move from 9th grade, to 10th grade, to 11th grade and finally 12th grade, their grades and attendance, citizenship grades and test scores are tracked and recorded on a transcript. Every high school student has an individual, personal transcript. When students have completed all graduation requirements, they receive a very sophisticated, official document called the high school diploma.

High School Diploma Options

Most Granite School District students will earn a high school diploma by the end of the senior (12th grade) year from the high school they are attending. Students who earn the high school diploma have made commitments: to attend school regularly; to take and pass required and elective classes to total 27 credits; and, to meet UBSCT requirements. The high school diploma proudly displays the school's name and the student's name.



Some students will receive a high school diploma from an alternative school (like Granite Peaks High School) a non traditional program, or Granite Peaks Learning Center (adult education). Students can find information on specific requirements by exploring the links below.

The Granite District Board of Education approved policy in June 2007 that students can earn a Granite District diploma by meeting the 24 credit requirements outlined by the Utah State Office of Education (R277-700).
