What is the SEP or SEOP process?

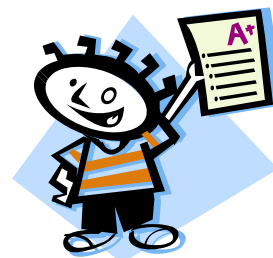
Did you know?

SEP stands for Student Education Plan, and it is a practice in elementary schools for teachers to meet with students and their parents to celebrate student success.

SEOP stands for Student Education Occupation Plan, and it is a planning process in secondary schools involving students, their parents, and a school counselor.

SEP

In elementary school, students and their parents meet with their teacher at least three times every year. The meeting is called the SEP (Student Education Plan). It is time set aside to celebrate student success and identify areas for improvement. Students with the help of their parents and their teachers write goals and actions to help them work toward greater success in school.



SEOP

In secondary schools, students and their parents meet with a school counselor at least annually as part of the SEOP process. In addition to the annual meeting, students are learning about school options and opportunities in counselor led guidance curriculum activities.

SEP or SEOP

Both the SEP and the SEOP processes are key to helping students find success in school by having: the BEST SCHEDULE (appropriate placement); knowledge of their INTERESTS and ABILITIES; the ability to set and work toward GOALS; PARENTS who are involved in their education; and, a PLAN for school success today and for the future.
