Can I really earn an associate's degree while in high school?

Did you know?

If you take advantage of concurrent enrollment classes offered in Granite School District and map out a plan to connect those classes to an associate's degree, you may earn enough concurrent enrollment credit to graduate from high school with an associate's degree through Salt Lake Community College, Utah Valley State College, or Weber State University.



New Century Scholarship

Your high school has an agreement with Salt Lake Community College (and other colleges in Utah) that allows you to earn college credit while you are still in high school. The high school/college classes are called **concurrent enrollment** classes. Concurrent enrollment classes include English 1010 (Introduction to Writing), Math 1050 (College Algebra) to The **New Century Scholarship** Program was created in 1999 by the Utah Legislature to provide scholarship opportunities to Utah students who take a planned sequence of concurrent enrollment courses that complete the requirements of an associate degree by September 1 of the year their class graduates.
