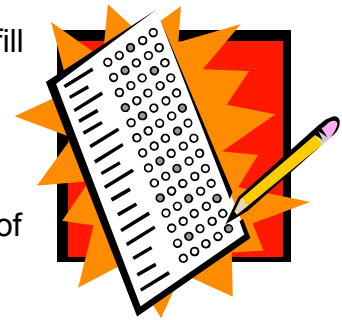
What is the UBSCT?

Did you know?

The **U**tah **B**asic **S**kills **C**ompetency **T**est, or UBSCT, measures “basic” concepts drawn from the Utah Core Curriculum. It is organized in three sections -- reading, language, and math.

High school students must pass each section of the test and fulfill other graduation requirements in order to receive a high school diploma. Once a section is passed, it does not need to be taken again.

High school students will take the test the first time in February of 10th grade. Each section of the test will be given on a separate day and will take about 90 minutes to complete. Students who don't pass any or all sections of the test in 10th grade can retake any or all sections in October and February in 11th or 12th grade.



If a student has documentation of at least three attempts to pass each section of the UBSCT and does not, the high school diploma will indicate that he/she has not passed.
