2009 Child ID Campaign

According to The National Childhood Identification Program, it is estimated that one child becomes lost or goes missing every 40 seconds. To combat this crisis, Subway Restaurants is partnering with local law enforcement to launch Subway's Child ID Campaign. The purpose of the campaign is to properly equip parents with child identification materials in the case their child becomes lost or goes missing.

These kits include sections for fingerprinting, hair DNA samples, dental records, child photos, personal and medical information, child physical characteristics, and child safety tips, (essentially everything that the police would need to issue an Amber Alert if needed.) According to state police agencies, having this information quickly accessible in an emergency is invaluable as it helps them do their vitally important work more efficiently.

During the week of Halloween, Subway Restaurants will have free Child ID Kits in-store for people to pick up
